# Chapter 3: Blessed are the...

As I looked around at the disciples, I wasn't sure they understood any more than I did what Jesus was trying to say. In fact, I think the disciples began to get worried when Jesus began to say that you are blessed when people insult you and say all kinds of evil against you. I am sure I saw a couple of them break out in a sweat. I can't imagine anyone hating these men. They are good and kind. They have left everything to follow Jesus. Why would anyone persecute them? It is nice to know that there is a reward in heaven, but I am hoping that is a long way off!

I thought maybe Jesus would be done talking, or at least stop and explain things. Instead he just kept going. He must have known we were all confused. He seemed to be on a roll and just kept teaching us things.

He told us we were the salt of the earth and the light of the world. This at least made sense to me. Of course, you would not light a lamp and put it under a bowl that would not do any good at all. If you are going to light a lamp, then you need to put it where the light makes a difference for everyone in the house. The lamp can only work if it is allowed to shine.

This time I felt like Jesus explained himself better. He told us that if we needed to let our light shine before others so that they may see our good deeds and praise our Father in Heaven. I want my light to shine. I don't want to hide under a bowl. Though I do wonder how good I am. Do I do enough good deeds to let others see God? I am just one small mouse. Can I really make a difference? How can I let my light shine?

That night as I was getting ready to go to sleep, Jesus words kept swirling around in my head. Was I blessed? What did it mean to be blessed? It seemed like Jesus' values were not the ones that I had been experiencing all my life. Jesus was changing everything. This adventure was getting bigger and bigger. As I curled up in the bottom of Simon's bag, I wondered if my light was shining at all. I spend so much time trying not to be noticed that I am not sure my light ever shines.

I can't stop following Jesus now. There is still so much I don't understand. There is still so much to see and experience. I can't wait to see what tomorrow will bring.
