Devotional Thought...



When I read the theme for the ABCPAD Leadership Conference: **Remember Rejoice Renew** it resonated with me. During the last Small Group, I struggled with the Chapter "What We Overhear about the Future." We are called to help change the world to be more in alignment with the vision of God. Yet, I looked around at the violence and evil in our present world at the same time churches are closing or becoming smaller and Christianity is being attacked on many fronts. How are we to change the world with fewer and fewer people active in the faith? Tony Compolo gave a few historical examples of people overcoming evil, most notably during the Nazi regime, with the German people and saving many of the Jewish people.

It made me stop and remember other groups and missionaries who still serve willingly in countries where violence is the norm. I remember a church close to my home who go to the Children's Village in Africa every two years to build schools and residences and teach the mamas how to care for traumatized children. I remember the church of a friend's son in Pittsburgh who plants a Community Garden every summer and teaches their youth how to serve others by providing food. I remember the church down the street who draws over a thousand people to watch their Easter Play and the last days of Jesus. I remember our church who sponsors a food bank and feeds seniors and others in our community.

Everyone can spread the works of Jesus in their own community as we rejoice in the Kingdom of God. We can *renew* our faith in the fact that the Church, and its work goes on because nothing is too hard for God, and we are his workers.
